



Seven new apartments, including a penthouse and three mews houses, are tucked away in a peaceful, cobbled mews just behind Battersea Library. The development uses the original Victorian old bakery buildings and the surrounding courtyard of stables and coach houses. Entrance is via a private gate into the unchanged cobbled courtyard.

Tradition has it that the deep scores on parts of the brickwork on Lavender Walk were made by children waiting with their pennies in the queue for bread.

Some of London's most dynamic and creative architectural and interior design practices, helped transform Bakery Place into spacious contemporary properties, which embrace the history of the building and blend historical features – like the exposed brickwork with double-height top-lit spaces and lightweight steel stairs.

Their brief was to maximise the modern and optimise the original so that character and charm has been preserved.

The interiors exude an understated, industrial-chic elegance, akin to a Manhattan loft, with vaulted ceilings, brickwork walls, polished concrete and limed oak floors. But it's the discreet, private location and feeling of serenity that makes Bakery Place so special.

The homes are just around the corner from Clapham Junction, one of the best connected stations in Europe with over 2,000 trains departing daily and with direct links to London Victoria and Waterloo, as well as Gatwick Airport. Bakery Place is also a short stroll from the 200 green acres of Clapham Common.
